From the State Chair

The annual APS National Conference, which was held in Canberra, from 4th to 8th October, was very successful with many interesting speakers and workshops and excellent Keynotes, such as: Professor Kelly Brownell, whose presentation addressed “The Causes and Prevention of Obesity” – an issue which is becoming a burgeoning health problem in the Western World.

Also of note was the Keynote presentation by Professor Krzysztof Kaniasty, who addressed the topic of “Social Psychological Reaction of Communities Coping with Natural and Human Induced Disasters”.

Although both these speakers were from overseas, their topics were very relevant for Australia both now and in the future.

Attendance at the Conference was lower than usual, perhaps due to the location or the increased number of CPD events on offer, however, the conference was of the usual high standard that we have come to expect from the APS.

Our own WA State Conference is drawing close and by the time this Newsletter goes to press, it will be over. It has been a well supported event and thanks are extended to all those involved; the organising committee; the volunteers; workshop leaders; presenters and most importantly all those who attended the conference to make it a success.

We will not be holding a WA State Conference in 2012, as the National APS Conference will be held in Perth from 25th to 29th September 2012 at the Perth Convention and exhibition Centre.

At the APS AGM on Thursday 6th October, 3 new APS Board Members were elected. We were delighted that our own Alan Plumb from WA was elected as an APS Board member for two years, together with Erica Frydenberg and Mike Kyrios. Tim Hannan was elected President Elect and will take over from Simon Crowe in 2012.

Our sincere congratulations are extended to Alan and the other newly elected APS Board directors and we wish them well during their term of office.

We extend thanks to Dr Deborah Wilmoth, who was appointed to the APS Board to represent WA during 2011. Thank you from all of us Deborah for your contributions.

At the APS Conference in Canberra, one of our WA members, Dr Chris Lee was awarded the Ian M Campbell Memorial Prize in Clinical Psychology. This is the first time a member from WA has won this prestigious prize, which is awarded to an APS member who has made an outstanding contribution to the scientific or professional status of Clinical Psychology in Australia. Congratulations are extended to Chris for his outstanding work and research which led to the winning of this award.

Congratulations are also extended to Dr Deborah Wilmoth who won the APS Clinical Psychology prize for her contribution to the Clinical College over many years

Don't forget National Psychology Week, which will extend from Sunday 13th November to Saturday 19th November 2011. It is hoped that as many members and branches as

possible participate in community based activities to show case our profession to the public.

You will note on this newsletter, the new APS Logo, which was launched at the APS Conference in Canberra. This particular logo was chosen from many variations which were generated by the graphic design company assigned to the task. It was selected because it represents the APS from the past and extending into the future, giving us a fresh “new look”. Great Southern (Albany) WA Branch

The Great Southern WA Branch has continued to meet on a monthly basis to provide a forum for member concerns and an update in both national and regional news.

At the October Branch meeting, the CEO Ms Suzanne Leavesley of the South West Medicare Local was our guest speaker. She gave us a comprehensive review of the stage of development of the Medicare Local initiative and the future priorities for the region. There was a large attendance of members interested to hear about the proposed mental health funding in the region.

Ms Leavesley encouraged as many people as possible to become members of the South West Medicare Local in order to receive timely information and have some input into the funding of services in the region. She has encouraged APS Branch members to inform her of Medicare shortfalls and inadequacies eg. Parental interviews not covered when a child is referred under Better Access. Concerns were raised about the cutbacks in the Medicare Better Access funding and the current underdevelopment of ATAPS funded services to provide services for clients with complex mental health needs. The Great Southern (Albany) Branch looks forward to developing a collaborative relationship with the South West Medicare Local.

The Branch is also preparing for Psychology week and has registered an activity aimed at focussing on the stress level of the practitioner, reducing compassion fatigue and building further connections within the branch through participation. A yoga session has been arranged with a local practitioner for members on Friday November 18th, 830 to 1000 to emphasise the need for self care. The session is being paid for from Branch funds to assist with maximising the benefits of local membership.

With the new professional development cycle commencing December 1st the Branch has decided to get started early with providing local PD. We have invited Ms Elspeth Myers, a paediatric speech pathologist to present a seminar on December 1st at 5:30pm followed by wine and snacks. The seminar will focus on the infant mental health

The South West branch of the APS is holding a seminar at 6.30pm Monday, 14th November at the Rural Clinical School of Medicine which is situated on campus at Edith

Cowan University in Bunbury. Dr Steven J. Kiely will talk about his research on Emotional Labour – An invisible work stressor. Emotional labour is a topic that has received significant scholarly attention over the last 30 years. Emotional labour is an invisible role requirement that is present in almost all occupations, but is most prevalent in human service jobs e.g., psychologists, social workers, nurses, medical practitioners, and teachers. The presentation will examine the antecedents and consequences of emotional labour along with potential recommendations to effectively manage this hidden job demand.

Dr. Steven J. Kiely is a consulting performance psychologist in Perth, Western Australia. His educational qualifications include a Bachelor of Psychology from Murdoch University, a Master of Organisational Psychology from Curtin University, a Diploma of Clinical Hypnosis, and a PhD in Sport Psychology from the University of Western Australia. Dr. Kiely operates a private practice working with individuals in professional sport, business, and the military; and has consulted to a number of professional organisations including the West Coast Eagles, the West Coast Fever, and the Special Air Services Regiment (SASR). Report from the APS National Office

This regular report provides information on some of the recent activities and news from the APS National Office.

Results of APS Board of Directors election 2011

An election for the President-Elect and two General Director positions on the APS Board of Directors was held and the result was declared at the Society's AGM on 6 October 2011. The successful candidate for the President-Elect is **Mr Tim Hannan FAPS**. Following a 12-month term as President-Elect, Tim Hannan will assume the office of President of the Society from the AGM in 2012 for a two-year term. As Tim is currently a Director on the APS Board, his election to President-Elect has produced a third vacancy for a General Director on the Board. Therefore three successful candidates have been elected to General Director positions on the Board and they are **Associate Professor Erica Frydenberg FAPS** and **Professor Mike Kyrios FAPS** for three-year terms, and **Mr Alan Plumb FAPS** for a two-year term to fill the vacancy left by Tim Hannan. At the first meeting of the new APS Board of Directors following the AGM, two additional Directors were appointed to provide greater Board diversity. These are **Ms Sue Carter** and **Dr Nick Reynolds MAPS** who have each been appointed for a one-year term. Profiles of all members of the new APS Board can be found on the APS website under 'About the APS'.

New APS Divisions to give all members a forum

As part of the governance review of the Society, the recent work of the APS Constituent Units Review Committee investigated whether alternative structures might better meet the needs of the Society to ensure the APS fulfils its primary function of serving its members. In particular the Committee considered how to give greater representation to all members, particularly non-specialist psychologists and academics and educators, some of whom did not have a particular 'home' within the current member group structure.

The Review Committee recommended a new Divisional structure to ensure that all categories of members have a forum with which to engage to make policy recommendations, and to facilitate communication throughout the APS. The three new Divisions will be:

1. Division of Specialist Psychological Practice
2. Division of General Psychological Practice
3. Division of Research, Education and Training

This new structure will ensure that there is a strong voice for all sections of the APS membership, and will enable tailored advocacy and policy preparation, and the development of resources and initiatives to suit their particular needs. The functions and processes associated with the new Divisions within the Society are still being finalised, but they will have a direct conduit to the Board of Directors and National Office through regular meetings with the Executive Director and President, as currently happens with the College Chairs' Forum.

Evolution of the APS logo

An initiative to enable greater recognition of the APS postnominals (Hon FAPS, FAPS, MAPS, Assoc MAPS) that signify belonging to the peak professional organisation for psychology has commenced. This has entailed an evolution of the APS logo so that it more prominently displays the APS acronym that is used in the postnominal letters, while still retaining links to the previous logo. The 'refreshed' logo reflects the APS history as a learned society through the retention of the tree of knowledge, but provides a more forward-looking image and prominent APS acronym that will assist in increasing awareness of the meaning of APS members' postnominals. The refreshed APS logo was launched at the APS Conference and will gradually be incorporated across all APS communications materials, resources and stationery in the coming months. The changes to the APS logo are part of a wider initiative to ensure that all APS members benefit from the growing strength and prominence of the Society.

Deadline for meeting CPD requirements is fast approaching

The end of the first annual continuing professional development (CPD) cycle under the new arrangements is imminent, and all CPD requirements must be met by 30 November 2011. There is a complex array of mandatory CPD requirements for maintenance of general registration with the Psychology Board of Australia, membership of the Australian Psychological Society, and Medicare provider status. Those members who have not yet commenced logging their CPD using the APS online CPD logging system are strongly encouraged to do so to assist them in understanding, organising and tracking their individual CPD requirements. The APS has also developed comprehensive CPD information which is available on the website. The APS CPD resources and logging system can be accessed from the APS website under 'CPD and Events'.

Registration renewal with the Psychology Board of Australia due by 30 November 2011

All members who hold full ('general') registration with the Psychology Board of Australia are reminded that registration renewal is due by 30 November 2011. Psychologists in all States and Territories of Australia (including those with non-practising registration) are required to renew their registration by this date. The only exception to this is psychologists who hold provisional registration, who must renew their registration on their anniversary date. The registration renewal process is being managed by the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA). Psychologists will be notified by email and mail that registration renewal is due. There are substantial late fees and serious consequences if registration is not renewed on time, so members are urged to renew their registration by 30 November 2011 to avoid these problems.

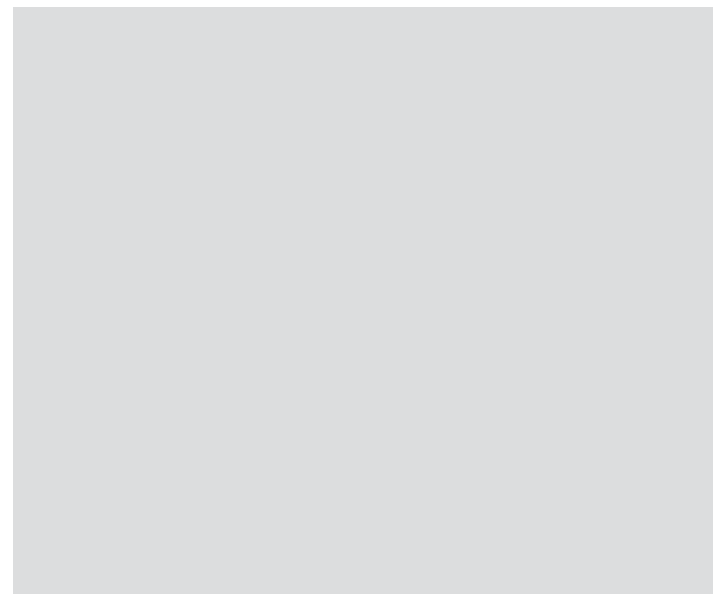
WA Forensic College

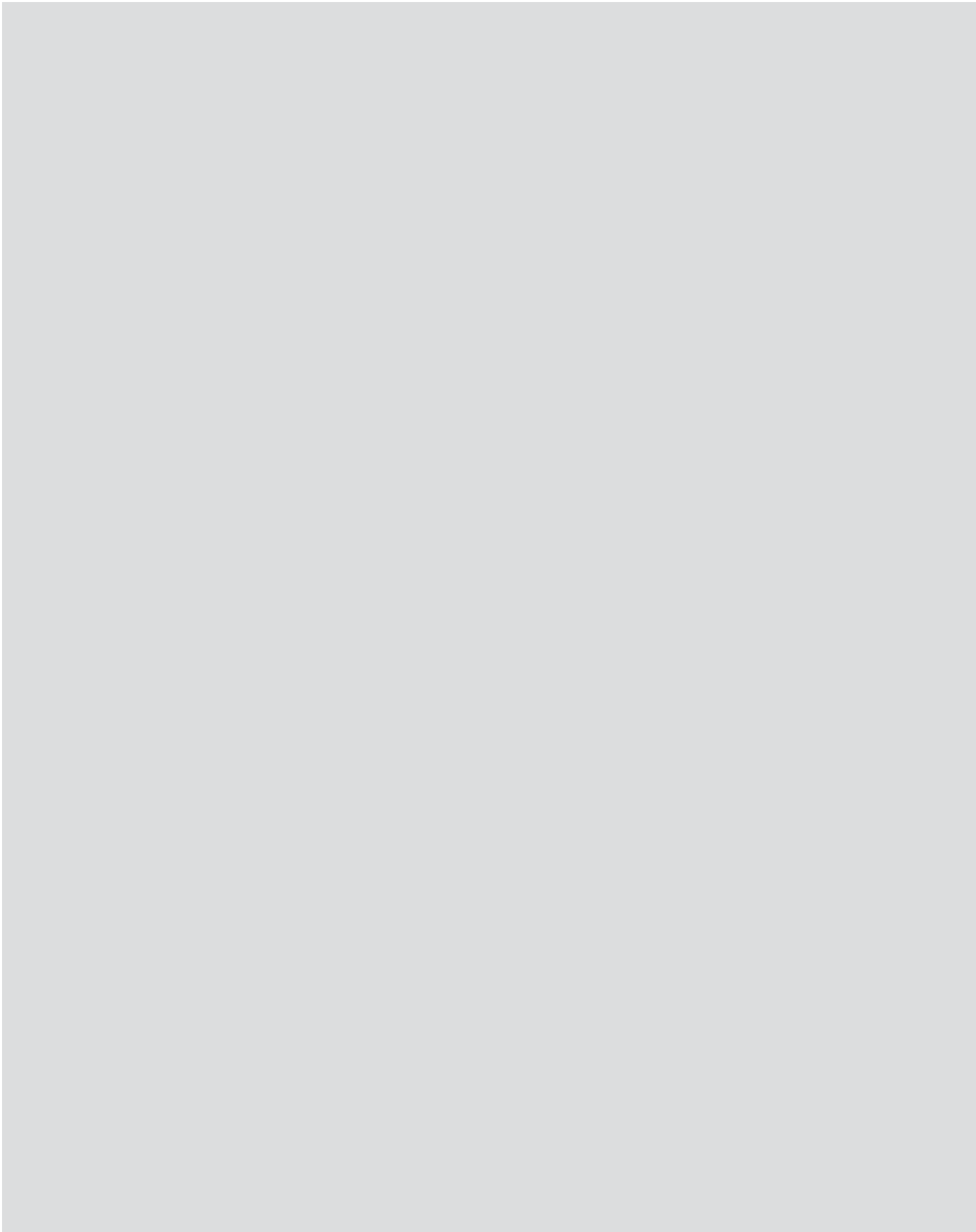
College members meet every couple of months to discuss case presentations as a way to meet some of the PsyBA peer supervision and active PD requirements.
